THE KEY POINTS

- This \$6.8 million project, known as the High Bay Project, will add 30,000 square feet of high technology industrial manufacturing space to Hartzell's Piqua operations and will feature a 23-foot under hook crane height and a new 30' x 30' sand blast room.
- Hartzell Air Movement currently encompasses both axial and centrifugal fans built for longevity within the rigorous requirements necessary for industrial environments.
